It has been quite a while since the bookworm has read a bridge book. As a beginner on the learning curve, I confess to reading several publications but as knowledge was gained, interest waned until I reached the stage where reading any bridge publication was guaranteed to put me to sleep. You know the feeling – you've read half a page and then realise you have no recall of what you just read!

Of late I've been scrolling through the library catalogue hoping to find a gem to recommend to our beginners and emerging players and have hit the jackpot.

The bookworm has always been a big fan of Ron Klinger and we have several of his works in the library, all worthy of borrowing, but his "When to Bid, When to Pass" is a real find.

He goes into great detail in hand evaluations for opening bids with sound arguments against Bergen's "Rule of 20" and an alternative method in valuing distributional hands. Without going into too much detail, there is a wealth of helpful information for all bidding situations from overcalls, pre-empts and in the competitive auction. As he states in the introduction, the aim of the book is to guide you in those situations where the best action is inaction.

I got a lot out of this book, and even managed to stay awake. If only I could get one of my partners to read it!

We have 2 copies in the library. Highly recommended – Try it. The Bookworm

#### Our Newest Grand Master - Margaret Plunkett

In early 2013, I had been playing bridge almost entirely at QCBC and Toowong bridge clubs, and rarely at Northern Suburbs. I mentioned to Lorraine Collins, a long-time member of this club, that I would prefer to play at Northern Suburbs. Even though I was a member at the other clubs, Northern Suburbs was my home club and closer to where I live. I just needed a partner.

Lorraine had someone in mind. She said a lady by the name of Margaret Plunkett may be interested in partnering me at Northern Suburbs. Marg was the club's Secretary. I contacted Marg and we agreed to play together. We didn't do all that well bridge-wise the first few times, but we both wanted to continue the partnership.

There was a Butler Pairs Congress coming up at the Gold Coast club in June that year so I asked Marg if she would like to go with me to play in that event. She said she would have to think about it. Really? What was there to think about? She asked Lorraine and Elizabeth Gibson if she should play in the congress with me. Elizabeth was the club's President then. From my understanding, they both said "Yes! Yes! Go! Go!" or words to that effect. Marg agreed to play with me in the Gold Coast club's 2013 Butler Pairs Congress. Thus began Marg's journey to ABF Grand Master.

I picked Marg up on the way as we drove down to the Gold Coast club to play in the Butler Pairs Congress. We were ranked 43<sup>rd</sup> out of the 52 pairs entered. In the first round we got smashed by the opposition, dropping to 49<sup>th</sup> position, however during the day we gradually worked our way back up the field to finished 12<sup>th</sup> overall. We thought we had lost the last round and headed back home before the presentations. In the car on the way back I came to the view that we had won the last round. Yes, we had. We discovered later that we had won a C Category prize for our efforts. It was our first congress together and we did well enough to win a small amount of prizemoney. Marg was hooked. She was keen to play in more congresses.

In 2015, Margaret paired up with Albert Loh to play in the Restricted Pairs at the Gold Coast Congress. In a field of 108 pairs, they came 6<sup>th</sup> overall in the final. As a Queensland pair, the Queensland Bridge Association offered them the opportunity to play in the Restricted Butler Pairs of the Australian National Championships being held in Fremantle. As sponsor, the QBA paid their entry fee and some additional costs. They played and finished 7<sup>th</sup> overall.

Marg and I played in the Intermediate division of the Bobby Richman Pairs Championship at the 2017 Gold Coast Congress. In the Qualifying rounds, playing East-West, we just snuck into the top fourteen by 0.02 matchpoints. The top fourteen pairs in both directions played in the A final. Everyone else played in the B, C or D finals. There were three rounds in the A final. At the end of the first round, we were running 14<sup>th</sup> out of 28 pairs. We came 3<sup>rd</sup> in both the second and third rounds. When the three rounds were totalled, we were placed 2<sup>nd</sup> overall in the A final, just 0.38 matchpoints behind first place – probably the difference of just one trick. So close. We were very happy with the result and how well we played.

One of the country club congresses we have often played in is the Lockyer Pairs. It is held in July, so it was always very cold early in the morning and there was no heating at the venue. At lunchtime they offered a variety of delicious hot soups. Eventually they moved to another venue which wasn't as cold, but no more hot soups. In 2019, Marg and I won the Lockyer Pairs congress.

Marg and I have been regular bridge partners for almost eleven years. We have won some NSBC competitions and played in a multitude of competitions at Brisbane clubs and many congresses in and around South-East Queensland. We have travelled to Canberra, Coffs Harbour, Mackay, Cairns, and Gold Coast to play at gold point congresses. It has been a great adventure, enjoyable, rewarding and satisfying.

It is a long journey to reach ABF Grand Master ranking. For the rank of Grand you need a total of 1,000 masterpoints of which 200 must be gold and 700 must be a combination of red and gold. Marg crossed the 1,000 masterpoints threshold in March this year having already accumulated sufficient red and gold masterpoints. Marg is ecstatic having finally reached that milestone. Since joining our club some eighteen or so years ago, Marg has been a very dedicated member and hard-working volunteer of our club, performing the roles of Secretary, committee member on several occasions, and now Masterpoints Secretary for the past several years. Congratulations Marg, it is a well-deserved achievement.
