

Shortly after this, she met her regular partner, Catherine Flowers and has continued playing at NSBC ever since.

Andrea has taken to bridge like a duck to water. She won the Club's Leita Lieper award in 2020, in 2023 Andrea and

Helen Baran won the Hoffmann Tray and this year came 3rd along with her team mates in the QBA Teams of 3.



After close to eight years in the role of Treasurer, Andrea will be signing off.

One can only agree that she has done an exemplary job through unchartered waters over the past few years. Andrea has navigated through COVID, transitioned from cash to My ABF and changed the club's accounting software from MYOB to XERO. Each a considerable task in itself.

However, the increasing compliance and regulation around the role has taken its toll. The position of Treasurer is a large one, with many jobs falling under its ambit. As NSBC is the second largest club in QLD and ninth in Australia, the Management Committee has elected to split this important volunteer position into more manageable, smaller, tasks to be split between three – four people.

Accordingly the role will be divided into the following areas; Accounts Payable, Session reconciliations, Compliance (i.e. BAS, OFT, Tax), Subscriptions & Payroll. The Club's accounting software allows for much of the

work to be done remotely. If you have any financial, accounting, bookkeeping experience we ask that you offer your services to the club. It is a rewarding experience helping NSBC to prosper.

Andrea will be stepping down at the end of this financial year (January 25) but has offered to continue as a support person in the background offering full training and mentoring to those kind people who step up.

Finally, and most importantly on behalf of NSBC members we would like to extend a Heartfelt thank you to Andrea for the many years of work she has volunteered to the Club.

LIBRARY NEWS

We have two new books into the library – both kindly donated by members.

"Master of Bridge Psychology" by Jeppe Juhl looks inside the incredible mind of Swedish champion Peter Fredin, winner of multiple international events over many years. The book showcases Fredin's audacious style from his beginnings as a talented teenager to his entry onto the world stage representing his country.



It is a fascinating and entertaining read and gives an insight into the intellectual level of the master bridge players of the world. The one thing that you will learn from this book is how little you know about the game, particularly declarer play!

The other donated book is by David Bird and Larry Cohen titled "Defense on The Other Hand" (apologies for the American spelling). Both are prolific authors of bridge books (Bird is an eight times winner of the American Bridge Teachers' Book of The Year Award) and renowned players.

The reader is presented with 100 different defensive scenarios with one hand presented by David Bird and the other by Larry Cohen, and is given the challenge of choosing the correct line of defence. Each deal is then summarised under a heading of "understanding why". Personally, I like this style of teaching as the reader is prompted to think rather than read, thereby giving a better chance of etching correct behaviours into the memory bank.

This is a fine addition to the library and is recommended to players of all levels.

Members are reminded that the allowed borrowing time for a book from the reference library is **one month**. This leaves adequate time to read the borrowed item. The librarian should not have to contact borrowers for items that are sometimes weeks or even months past due.

Sultana and Currant Tea Loaf

Ingredients:

175g sultanas and 175g currants 300ml hot Earl Grey Tea 275g self raising flour 225g light brown sugar 1 large egg lightly beaten

Butter for greasing tin

Use baking paper to line tin after greasing

Baking tin measurements are: 24x14x7cm loaf tin

Method

Put dried fruit into a bowl and pour over hot tea. Stir and cover and leave to soak overnight. Grease and line with baking paper a 24x14x7cm loaf tin Preheat oven: All ovens are different so check your oven guide. I preset my oven at 170 C fan force. My oven is not a hot oven. Add flour, sugar and egg to the bowl of soaked fruit and mix thoroughly with a wooden spoon. Spoon into the prepared baking tin. Bake for about 1 hour and 30 minutes approximately or until the cake has risen and just firm to the touch. Check at 1 hour and 15 minutes and remove if done. Cool in the tin for about 10 minutes. Turn out cake and remove paper. Place on a wire rack to cool further.

To serve..... cut into thick slices and spread with butter.
